On Tuesday, October 23, 2018 thirteen of our twenty-two Grand Jurors metand inspected the following:

Liberty County Jail:

During our inspection of the Liberty County Jail we met with Mr. Jeff Hein, Jail Administrator. He was very cooperative and informative. He walked us through different corridors of the jail. We learned that the inmate phone pays for 60% of the inmate's needs. They have padded cells for the inmates that may harm others or themselves along with onsite doctors and nurses. We the Grand Jury do have some suggestions for the upcoming budget for the Liberty County Jail.

More budgeting for more guards. We suggest possibly building a block pacifically for inmates with mental health issues. Due to mental facilities closing there are more and more persons being incarcerated with mental issues. They are sometimes a harm to guards, inmates and themselves.

During our inspections we noticed that Tower 2 isn't safe for inmates nor guards without a fire escape. We suggest a fire escape be built.

We also suggest that !lie facilities be updated to handle emergencies such as hangings, places for tear gas to be administered in case of riots, and easier access for the guards to get in the cells quicker in case of an emergency.
