Standing Order Governing the Use of Artificial Intelligence and Certification of Citations
Appearing in Motions. Briefs, and Orders

The Superior Courts of the Atlantic Judicial Circuit, sua sponte, hereby order that all motions, pleadings, briefs, orders, and other similar written media filed in Superior Court or presented to the Judges of said courts, identify if artificial intelligence ("AI") was utilized in the creation of the document in accordance with the following requirements:

I. Scope

1. This Order applies to all instances where an artificial intelligence tool (i.e. ChatGPT or other AI Apps or Software) is used in any capacity to prepare, draft, research, or review a document.
2. This Order applies to all motions, pleadings, briefs, orders, or other similar written media that is filed with, or presented to the Judges of, the Superior Court.
3. This Order applies to all cases appearing on the dockets of the Superior Court.
4. This Order applies to attorneys and pro se, or self-represented, litigants.

II. Compliance

1. Any attorney or pro se litigant who uses AI in the manner referenced above to generate a document shall include the following certification within the document:

3. Mistake, lack of technical expertise, or time constraints will not be accepted as good faith excuses for noncompliance with this Order.
4. The use of AI does not relieve any attorney or pro se litigant of their ethical obligations and/or professional obligations (e. g. Georgia Rules of Professional Conduct 1.1 and 3.1).

III. Effective Date

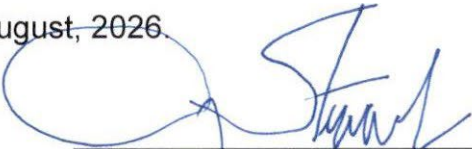
This Order applies to all filings in all cases in the Atlantic Judicial Circuit made subsequent to the filing of this Order.

IV. Duration

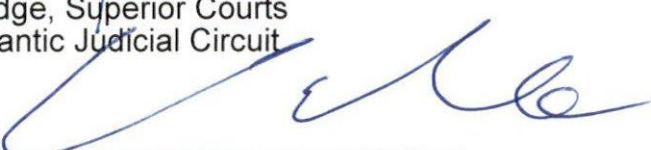

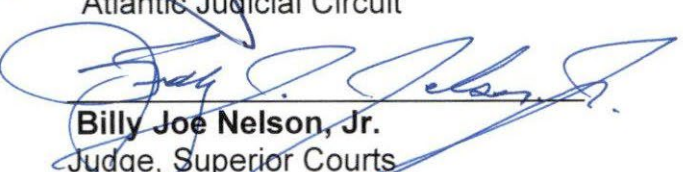
